



# The Olympianist will cycle 1200 miles in 21 days with piano 'in tow' giving recitals across Britain to raise funds for UK music & children's charities

# 'A remarkably gifted artist' Gramophone

To raise money for music and children's charities, concert pianist Anthony Hewitt -



the Olympianist - will cycle with piano 'in tow' from Land's End to John O'Groats to complete 1,200 miles in 21 days. With a piano trailing in the BeethoVAN, the avid cyclist will cover up to 100 miles a day, giving 27 concerts en route. The Herculean journey across Britain's hilly countryside will see Anthony ascend more than 20,000 metres - the equivalent of more than twice the elevation of Mt. Everest. He will perform in established venues and remote locations with his piano on a pop-up stage on the back of the BeethoVAN.

His piano odyssey encompasses concert venues, market squares, cliff-tops, quarries and fields. Highlights of the tour include a concert with the Manchester Camerata, a recital in the Market Square at Newbury Spring Festival, a cliff-top performance in Portland and a concert on the shores of Lake Windermere.

The repertoire for the tour has been chosen to convey a sense of journey, energy, movement, dynamism and excitement reflecting Anthony's challenge. The concerts will include masterworks of the piano repertoire by Beethoven, Janáček, Schubert, Chopin, Rachmaninov and Franck. A new commission by **Stephen Goss**, aptly named *Piano Cycle*, will be premiered at the **Swaledale Festival** on May 19<sup>th</sup>

For the first time in piano history, the *Olympianist's* followers will be able to watch part of each recital from the performer's viewpoint. Each day he will perform one of the 21 movements from Schumann's *Carnaval* Op. 9 in chronological order and film himself with a Go Pro Hero 2 Sports Camera attached to his head.







Each movement will be uploaded to his website for viewing. This will be the first time



that a professional musician will film himself in concert. The Olympianist's progress on tour is also traceable on Twitter, via a Fleetsmart tracker and on his website.

Anthony Hewitt's communicative and virtuosic pianism has won him many plaudits worldwide as a recitalist, chamber musician, and soloist with orchestras. He was a prize-winner of the William Kapell International Piano Competition and has

performed with the National Symphony Orchestra, USA and the Royal Philharmonic in London. He is also the founding Artistic Director of the Ulverston International Music Festival.

His epic journey will raise money for charities including *Mayor of London's Fund For* 

Musicians, Musequality, CLIC Sargent, Get Kids Going! and Classic FM Foundation.

Anthony is currently in training for his Olympian journey, both musically and physically. He cycles with Twickenham cycling club every week and will perform at various venues across London in the coming months. He will be performing at the Wigmore Hall on 5th February 2012 at 11:30am in a preview of the programme



for the Olympianist tour, and again on 2<sup>nd</sup> May with his piano trio, Dimension Trio. On 26<sup>th</sup> February at 6:30pm he will perform with Sarah-Jane Bradley at Kings Place for the London Chamber Music Society, and on 26<sup>th</sup> April he will perform Beethoven Piano Concerto No. 1 with Orpheus Sinfonia at St George's, Hanover Square.

# **Anthony Hewitt**

'A young pianist of outstanding talent'

Award-winning pianist Anthony Hewitt has performed as recitalist, concerto soloist and chamber musician to much critical acclaim. His diverse repertoire encompasses all styles and he champions contemporary composers with frequent new commissions. His enterprising projects include the founding of the Ulverston International Music Festival, now in its eighth year, which brings artists of international repute to a small Cumbrian market town.

Career highlights to date include orchestral engagements with the National Symphony and Princeton Symphony Orchestras in the USA, and the Royal

Philharmonic Orchestra and Northern Sinfonia in the UK. He has given four recitals at Wigmore Hall, and appeared across the USA including at Carnegie Weill Recital Hall.

His discography includes 'Protégé' (*Divine Art Records*), the first coupling on CD of the Liszt and Reubke Sonatas. This unique recording was described in *International Record Review* as "magisterial", and received a *Gramophone* recommendation.

An avid chamber musician, he recently joined Dimension Trio, winner of the prestigious Parkhouse award who are a frequent visitor to festivals and orchestras across Europe.

Highlights of upcoming concerts include a solo recital in Wigmore Hall's series on Sunday February 5<sup>th</sup> 2012 and an appearance with the English Chamber Orchestra at the Royal Festival Hall on Friday September 28 2012.

Anthony has been generously supported on his adventure by the kind people at *Thorn Hill Pianos*, who have provided him with pianos: a Feuerich model 161, 178 and upright pianos and *Wheelbase*, who have provided him with a Canondale Synapse bike
